

Naloxone saves lives.

Naloxone (also called Narcan) is a medicine that reverses opioid overdose. You can get it free at participating pharmacies and community organizations throughout Washington.

Carry naloxone with you. If you see an overdose, call 911. Then spray naloxone into the person's nostril. It's safe to use, even if the person didn't use opioids.
